

**KSA PUBLIC SAFETY COMMITTEE REPORT  
TO THE SOUTH WOODLAND HILLS VILLAGE COMMUNITY ASSOCIATION  
June 14, 2008**

The KSA Public Safety Committee met at the South Woodland Hills Community Room on Wednesday, June 11.

Officer Dwayne Ulrich presented the Houston Police Department crime report for May. Data for South Woodland Hills and Kingwood are as follows:

The only crime reported in South Woodland Hills was a burglary in the 1800 block of Fir Cove.

The largest number of reported crimes in the Kingwood area occurred in Kingwood Place West, which includes the commercial developments along US 59 and Loop 494. In May there was a total of 31 crimes reported, including 7 burglary of a motor vehicle, 7 auto theft 5 theft and 4 burglaries.

The Houston Police Department is concerned about speeding issues primarily on Kingwood Drive. There was a discussion about limited visibility at certain intersections along Kingwood Drive. This is an issue that has been repeatedly discussed at the quarterly joint trail association meetings, resulting in requests to the Houston Parks and Recreation Department to remove understory vegetation at certain intersections. The Department has responded to these requests, but apparently, there are more problem areas with limited visibility.

So far, there have been no reported cases of West Nile virus in Kingwood. A case was reported in Huffman, and mosquitoes that tested positive were found in ZIP code 77346 (south of the San Jacinto River).
